The order in which the classes will show in each department will be arranged by the Superintendent of each department. Exhibitors must be ready for the judging ring when class is called. The management reserves the right to change the judging hours when necessary.

General Fairbury Fair Rules

Rules and Regulations

The Fairbury Fair reserves the final and absolute right to interpret rules and regulations and to arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, or differences in regard thereto. It further reserves the right to amend or add to these rules as in its judgment it may determine, to withdraw all premium offerings in all departments should an emergency exist and circumstances demand.

General Arrangements

The 2022 Fair will commence on Wednesday, August 17, 2022 and continue for five days.

The office of the Secretary of the Fair will be located at the Fairgrounds from Monday, August 8, 2022 until the close of the fair and will be open daily from 8 am to 6 pm, fair week. Fair phone is (815) 692-3222. **Each exhibitor (13 or older) at the time of making an entry(s), must purchase one season ticket**, which will admit the exhibitor to the grounds. Effective January 1, 2010, each exhibitor will be assessed a processing fee of \$1.00 for each entry up to \$5.00.

No entries (in any department) will be made by the Secretary after 5:00 pm Friday, August 12, 2022. Entries by mail must be postmarked on or before this date and time. Animals or articles intended for exhibition must be on the grounds at or prior to 9:00 pm on Tuesday, August 16, 2022 **unless otherwise noted** in individual department information. **No phone entries will be allowed.**

All entries must be accompanied by a check or cash for entry fees, stall or pen fees, and season ticket. Social Security Number must be on the entry form. There will be no deviation from this rule. **Payment must be made either by check or cash.** Entry fees and stall or pen fees must be paid in full and may not be returned. No refund for stall or pen fees will be made to non-winners or no shows. Please make a copy of your entries for your own use. After entries are made they will not be changed by the Secretary unless an error has been made by the office. The management reserves the right to reject any entry not satisfactory to them.

Neither the Secretary nor any other office of the Fair shall disclose to competitors or to any other persons, what entries have been made, nor shall any other than the Secretary and other officers of the Fair be allowed to know that other entries have been made before the exhibition.

Every animal shown for a premium must be exhibited in the name of the bonafide owner except the get of the sire class. The party showing must be able to prove ownership for at least 30 days previous to the day of showing the animal if called on for proof of ownership by the Fair Association or the superintendent of the department where showing. All animals entered

in other than barrow, steer or wether classes must be recorded in their respective breed associations.

No animal is to occupy a stall or pen on the grounds of the Fair Association unless competing for a premium or is present as a nurse animal for others which are competing, and then the regular stall or pen fee must be paid for such animal. Stalls will not be assigned by the Superintendent until the stock has been duly entered on the Secretary's books.

All persons are strictly prohibited from fastening their stock to any tree within the fairgrounds.

Decisions of the judge in the department shall be final. Exhibitors may be barred from competition for finding fault with the decision of a judge. The interpretation of all rules governing the exhibit shall rest entirely with the Fair Association and their decision shall be final.

Regulations

Every animal or article exhibited on the grounds shall be under the control of the superintendent of its class and no article or animal shall be removed from the fairgrounds without permission of the President. Care will be taken to prevent loss or injury to animals or articles on exhibition, but the Association will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.

No animal will be allowed to run at large on the fairgrounds at any time.

Every animal must be entered for competition in the name of the owner or agent; poultry in the name of the owner; farm products and Floriculture in the name of the producer; Domestic Arts and Products of the kitchen in the name of the owner and made by the same.

Race Track

The Speedway Management will have charge of the track during the week of the Fair. The officers and agents of this Association waive all responsibility for injury to persons or animals taking part in races on the track. The Association will not be liable for damage either to persons or property while in that portion of the fairgrounds known as the "infield", race track, horse barns, hog pens, and cattle barns, or any other building leased by the Fair Association.

Concessions

Ground rent for booths, etc. will be established by the Superintendent of Concessions. When a lot or piece of ground shall be rented, the Superintendent of Concessions, Assistant Superintendent or the Secretary shall make a lease in duplicate, both to be signed by themselves and the lessee, one for lessee, the other to be given to or obtained by the Secretary. Said rent to be payable as follows: 50 percent of contract price at the time of making and delivering the lease, the balance to become due and payable on Friday of Fair Week. The Superintendent of Concessions is to keep an account of all leases turned over to the Secretary and make a detailed statement of the same in their annual report. **Each concession or exhibit must purchase at**

least one season ticket. No person shall be permitted to sell, barter, exchange or give away liquor. No person shall be allowed to occupy space or stand without having signed a privilege contract provided by the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Concessions or the Secretary. The Superintendent will place Concessions on the Fairgrounds on Tuesday of the week of the Fair. The management shall reserve the right to cancel any privilege contract for failure to comply with the rules governing the same. Each person contracting for a certain amount of space must sign an application stating the kind of business the permit is used for and confine themselves to the space assigned or forfeit their privilege without reimbursement. **All delivery truck drivers and helpers must have season tickets. Deliveries are to be made before noon.**

Electric, Light and Power

Connecting wires for concessions to our electric line is to be done by our staff only. No gasoline stoves, propane gas or casing head gas or any ethyl like commodity will be permitted in booths, under grandstand or in floral hall. Under no circumstances will any person or firm be allowed to place any advertising matter upon buildings, trees, or any place on the grounds, nor to distribute advertising matter outside of the places assigned to them.

Liability

Every precaution will be taken for the safeguarding of animals or articles placed on exhibit and automobiles and vehicles parked in their proper place, but The Association will not be responsible for any losses by fire, theft, or otherwise that may occur, either to licensees or others.

Neither this Association nor any of its officers or agents shall be liable for injury to any person or property of any person having license or privilege to exhibit on the Fairground, or to occupy any space. Neither this Association nor any of its officers or agents shall be liable for any damage, loss or injury to any person or property, caused by the negligent willful act of any person or their representatives or employees, having license or privilege or occupying space on said Fairgrounds, and all said licenses shall indemnify said Association, and its officers and agents against any expense or liability.

Rules Governing the Grounds

Riding or driving on the track by person or persons not competing for prize or purse will be charged with trespassing. Illinois statute provides a penalty for any person jumping the fence, and anyone caught doing so will be duly arrested.

Awards and Judging

Awards will be made by the single judge system, unless in the judgment of the Department Superintendent, more are required.

Judges will report to the Superintendent at the respective departments on the day fixed for awarding premiums on the lots which they are to respectively judge. Judges will be notified of the time of judging. A schedule will be posted in each department.

No person shall act as judge in any lot in which he/she may be interested as an exhibitor, agent or employee of an exhibitor or otherwise and, if such a case should be presented, the Superintendent of the Department may remove such interested judge, or substitute another judge temporarily.

The awards of premiums at the fair shall be confined to entries made in the Premium List.

No animal or article deemed unworthy shall be allowed to exhibit.

No exhibitor will be allowed more than two premiums under the same exhibit number.

First premium will be paid on one entry only when considered worthy by the judge.

Should any doubt arise as to the regularity of entry, or other important matter, which the judge feels incompetent to decide, he/she shall at once report the same to The Board for decision which, when made, shall be final.

All animals must be shown in all classes.

Check each Department for release times.

Any animal or article on exhibition, winning premiums, being removed at any time from Fairgrounds by an exhibitor or representative of the exhibitor, prior to their respective release times, will forfeit all premiums awarded to them in their respective classes.

Temporary borrowing or hiring animals or articles to strengthen the exhibit is strictly prohibited.

Articles of Fine Arts and Agriculture Products, in order to be entitled to receive premiums, must be owned, or have been executed or raised by the exhibitor. The Department Superintendent will see that this rule is strictly enforced. Persons violating this rule will forfeit the premium and not be allowed to exhibit for two years.

Department Superintendents are instructed that if they should have any good reason to believe that any exhibitor, by false entry or otherwise, attempts to deceive the judges or the public, and obtain a premium by misrepresentation, they shall report the facts to The Board, who in turn may expel such exhibitor for fraud for two or more years.

The decisions of the judges shall be final and no appeal will be considered except in case of protest.

Objections to any person serving as judge, may be submitted to the Department Superintendent in writing by exhibitors in that class, prior to making any award, giving good

and sufficient reasons therefore, and upon which, the Superintendent shall have full power to act.

Any exhibitor attempting to interfere with the judges during adjudications will be promptly excluded from competition.

Each award and notice of protest, if any made, must be written in a plain, careful manner by the Department Superintendent in ink or indelible pencil on the blank page opposite the entry.

The judge books must be returned, by the Superintendent of each department, to the Secretary. Books must be properly certified by the judge as soon as the awards in each case are completed.

Each superintendent shall exercise great care in preserving and returning the judge books of the department, as all checks for premiums are authorized only on the entries contained therein.

Ribbons or awards will be affixed on all premium animals shown in the rings at the time of the awards. Department Superintendents shall attach the ribbons awarded by the judges, to all other exhibited animals or articles.

Ribbons or awards must not be removed, once placed, without an order from The Board.

The Secretary will not issue an order to the Treasurer for premiums on animals or articles removed from exhibition before it's close (unless written authority from the President is given), and Class Superintendents are instructed to report to the Secretary's office any violation of this rule.

The sheriff shall have charge of the police forces on the grounds and attend to preserving order and enforcing the rules of The Association. It shall be their duty to arrest anyone creating disorder or violating any of the rules of The Fairbury Fair or the laws of the State.

All entries in all classes must be made in an individual's name.
NO group entries will be allowed.

1.	Entries in this department will close Friday, August 12, 2022 at 5:00 pm. No phone entries will be taken. The fair will run Aug 18-22, 2021.
2.	An entry fee of \$8.00 will be charged for each entry
3.	A stall fee of \$5.00 per head will be charged.
4.	No animals may arrive before 7 am Thursday, August 18th (You may bring tack on Wednesday evening). Animals must be in place by 12 pm Thursday, August 18th. Stalls will be assigned.
5.	Beef show is Friday August 19th at 9:00 am
6.	Release of Exhibits-at the discretion of the Dept Supt on Saturday of the fair
7.	A season ticket must be purchased by all exhibitors 13 years of age and older.
8.	The entry fee, stall fee, and season ticket fee must accompany the entry form. No stall will be available unless fees are sent with entry.
9.	IMPORTANT: Give the number of animals entered and stalls wanted.
10.	All cattle exhibited at the Fairbury Fair must be accompanied by a certificate of health issued and endorsed by a qualified veterinarian. Read, State of Illinois Rules and Regulations. Illinois steers and calves under 6 months of age are not required to have a certificate of health.
11.	Only cattle awarded first prize in a class ring are eligible to compete for a champion prize. Do not make entries in champion classes.
12.	Only two monies to each exhibitor in a lot will be allowed.
13.	Where only one exhibit is exhibited in a class, the exhibitor shall be declared first and be paid first money. However, ALL livestock must show.
14.	Animals cannot be entered as purebred unless they have been recorded on the

	recognized books in the name of the exhibitor record for their respective breed, and exhibitors must produce a certificate of registry at the request of the Department Superintendent. All first place winners will have their registration papers checked in the ring.
15.	“OTHER” refers to all exotic breeds for which there are recognized breed associations in the USA. Animals must be at least 1/2 bloods for females and at least 3/4 bloods for bulls. They all must possess proper breed association papers.
16.	Requirements for the ownership of animals are listed in general fair rules.
17.	Animals entered in the Junior show must be the property of the children showing them.
18.	All entries must appear on the entry blank submitted by the exhibitor. Entries will not be changed after the closing date. No refunds on entries.
19.	Market show: (Steers) (A) Market Animals will be weighed between 3 and 4 pm on Thursday, August 18 (B) IF NOT WEIGHED AT THIS TIME, THE ANIMAL MAY NOT BE SHOWN. (C) The Secretary’s office will divide the animals as evenly as possible. (D) Market animals can only be shown in one class. (E) Open Class Steers can be shown in Junior Dept. ONLY IF Junior Dept rules are complied with. The Fairbury Fair Association reserves the right to reject cattle entries when capacity of our cattle barn has been reached. To help with room, please do not store hay in the barns.
20.	Any tampering with living quarter water supplies is forbidden. Violators will be arrested and prosecuted. They also will be banned from the fair for a period of 5 years.
21.	No animals may be dyed.
22.	Calf from cow/calf class is eligible for Sr. Calf Class.
23.	Exhibitor numbers must be worn in the show ring.

- If a calf is under 6 months and is an Illinois steer, it is not required to have a Certificate of veterinary inspection.**

Submitted artwork will be judged on overall artistic merit, cleverness of subject, technique, originality, and skill. The natural color of the seeds and beans provides the only pigment to the pictures, as no paint or dyes are allowed. Only seeds and beans that are used for crops that can be grown in Illinois may be used. No portion of the seedpod is to be used in the artwork. The artwork is to be completely and exclusively created from whole and unadulterated naturally colored seeds and beans. Seeds should be affixed permanently to the surface with a clear or invisible adhesive. No shellac or polyurethane coatings. The seed portion of the artwork must be less than 3/4” thick. (If work is mounted on 1/2” thick board, the total thickness of the entry must be less than 1 1/4”.) Seeds may be layered or partially layered on top of one another as long as the total thickness does not exceed 3/4”. There should not be glass or plastic covering the artwork. All Crop Art entries must be accompanied by a 4”x6” list of the seeds used which clearly identifies the seeds used by their common crop name. This list should be attached to the back of the board. Crop Art entries are to be no larger than 400 square inches in area and mounted on a stiff flat board, such as plywood with suitable hanging brackets attached on the back. It is not necessary to have a rectangular shaped board. Pictures may have frames but are not required. The edges of the mounting board need not be seed covered, but should be suitably finished. Same Recipe: Banana Bread
Class G-7 Entry for 2022 Fairbury Fair

All participants are to bake the following recipe for this category.

Ingredients:

- 1 1/4 cups All Purpose Flour
- 1 1/4 cups Whole Wheat Flour
- 2 Teaspoons Baking Powder
- 3/4 Teaspoon Salt
- 1/2 Teaspoon Baking Soda
- 1/8 Teaspoon Nutmeg
- 1 1/2 cups mashed ripe Bananas (3 large)
- 1/4 cup Milk
- 2 Teaspoons Vanilla Extract
- 2/3 cups Sugar
- 1/2 cup margarine or butter (1 stick), softened
- 2 large Eggs, room temperature

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees

Grease a 9" x 5" metal loaf pan.

In medium bowl combine the flours, baking powder, salt, baking soda and nutmeg. In a small bowl, mix mashed bananas, milk and vanilla. In a large bowl, with a mixer at low speed, beat sugar with margarine or butter until blended. Beat for 2 minutes. Reduce speed to low and add eggs, beating well. Alternatively beat in flour mixture and banana mixture, beginning and ending with a flour mixture. Spoon batter into loaf pan and spread evenly. Bake 1 hour 5 minutes to 1 hour 10 minutes, until a toothpick, inserted in the center of the loaf, comes out clean. Cool loaf in pan on wire rack for 10 minutes then remove from the pan and cool completely

For the Fair Entry: Divide the cooled loaf exactly in half, choosing which half you'd like to use as your Fair entry. (Enjoy the other half at home.) Place the half loaf on a

sturdy paper plate, attaching your tag to the plate. Seal the 1/2 loaf and plate in a Ziploc bag. The 1/2 loaf will be judged on appearance and taste.

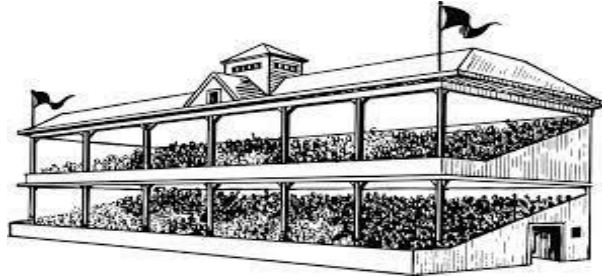
